# **CCCOA Senior Commodity Closet**

You may have heard about our new effort called the Commodity Closet. The purpose of the Commodity Closet is to help seniors get needed items.

The Commodity Closet runs on community donations of non-perishable food, toiletry and pet items. We make these items available to Crawford County seniors 60+ on open closet days (see activities calendar). On open days, seniors just simply stop by our building (the closet is open in the lunchroom), sign in, grab a bag and Courtney will assist you in getting the items you need. Each open Commodity Closet day has a limit for food and toiletry/pet items so we can serve the most seniors. We've had a great community response to donations and have received many great items like easy-to-prepare meals, juice, canned meats, canned fruits, soup and more. We also have cat food, dog food, laundry detergent, toilet paper and more.

There are no income guidelines. A person must be a Crawford County senior who is age 60 or older.

We are always accepting donations of non-perishable food, toiletry and pet items. Food donations must have a good date and no dented cans.


